Screenings for anemia.

6 Months



Last round of immunizations:

- Hep B.
- Rotavirus.
- DTaP.
- COVID-19.
- HiB.
- PCV.
- IPV.

Screenings for teeth.

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9 Months

Immunizations:

- Possible third dose of Hep B.
- Possible third dose of IPV.
- Seasonal influenza.

Developmental screenings.

12 Months

Immunizations:

- MMR.
- Hepatitis A.
- Chickenpox.

Screenings:

- Anemia.
- Eyes and ears.
- Blood pressure.
- Lead and TB.

15 Months

Immunizations:

- Catch up on any missing vaccines.
- Seasonal influenza.

18 Months

Immunizations:

- Catch up on any missing vaccines.
- Seasonal influenza.

Screenings:

- Height and weight.
- Behavior development.

24 Months

Immunizations:

- Catch up on any missing vaccines.
- Seasonal influenza.

Screenings:

- Lead.
- Eyes, ears and teeth.
- Developmental.

30 Months

Immunizations:

- Catch up on any missing vaccines.
- Seasonal influenza.

Physical exam to plot and compare growth.
